


MOU SIGNING CEREMONY BETWEEN CILTM AND MINISTRY OF HIGHER EDUCATION (MOHE)







MAKKAH HALAL FORUM 2025: A NEW ERA FOR THE HALAL INDUSTRY

The Makkah Halal Forum 2025 (MHF25), held recently from February 25-28, 2025, at the Makkah Chamber of Commerce Exhibition Centre in Saudi Arabia, was a groundbreaking event with the theme "Sustainable Development Through Halal." This prestigious forum brought together key stakeholders from around the globe to address the challenges and shape the future of the halal industry.

Tuan Hj. Baharudin Kamarudin FCILT, Chairman of the CILTM KL Section, had the honor of attending the event as part of a 20-member delegation from Northern Malaysia. The delegation was led by Datuk Sr Dr. Muhamad Farid Saad, Group Chairman of NL Group of Companies, and Tuan Hj. Mohd Nasri bin Hj. Adnan, Group Managing Director of NL Group of Companies. The delegation also included representatives from Penang's iconic Jeruk Pak Ali, Dato Haji Alias bin Haji Ali, and his exhibition entourage. Other notable attendees were Pengiran Muhammad Adil, co-founder of MOKTI's Ice Cream, and ChM. Dr. Mazita bt Mohd Diah, Senior Researcher at SIRIM. The MHF25 forum featured a wide array of activities designed to foster collaboration and innovation in the halal industry. Workshops, keynote sessions, discussion panels, and live halal cooking shows provided rich insights into sustainable practices and innovative solutions for halal trade. The event also created ample opportunities for partnerships and collaborations across various sectors, bringing together companies from 150 countries to form strategic alliances.

A major highlight of MHF25 was the focus on promoting innovation and creativity to support sustainable development within the global Islamic community. This aligns with the growing importance of the halal industry, which is projected to reach \$7.7 trillion by 2025, with the halal food and beverage sector contributing \$3.3 trillion. Furthermore, by 2034, the global halal market is expected to grow to \$9.45 trillion, driven by an annual growth rate of 12.42 percent, according to the Arab News Saudi Press Agency. MHF25 marks the beginning of a new era for halal events worldwide, offering a comprehensive showcase of the finest halal services and products. The forum is expected to have a lasting impact on the future of halal industries globally, further strengthening international trade and business

MAKKAH HALAL FORUM 2025: AN INSIGHTFUL INTERVIEW WITH DATUK SR DR. MUHAMAD FARID SAAD

During the Makkah Halal Forum 2025, Tuan Hj. Baharudin Kamarudin, Chairman of CILTM KL Section, had an engaging and insightful conversation with Datuk Sr Dr. Muhamad Farid Saad, Group Chairman of NL Group of Companies, Chairman of PEMIKIR (Pertubuhan Badan Pemikir Melayu Pulau Pinang), President of Pertubuhan Usahawan Muslim Pulau Pinang (USAHAWAN), and former ADUN of Pulau Betong, Balik Pulau, Penang (2004–2018).

The discussion centered on the growing global interest in halal and the critical role of halal logistics in maintaining a sustainable and intact halal ecosystem. Tuan Hj. Baharudin raised a pressing question: "Why are more people talking about halal and ensuring the ecosystem remains intact, emphasizing the role of halal logistics?" In response, Datuk Dr. Muhamad Farid Saad highlighted the worldwide surge in halal awareness, noting:

"The increasing focus on halal is a global phenomenon. Halal is fundamentally about cleanliness, safety, and security – values that resonate with everyone, regardless of religious background. Halal is for all."

He emphasized that as more individuals and businesses enter the halal ecosystem, the need for a robust and secure halal supply chain becomes crucial. This includes halal transportation and warehousing to ensure the integrity of halal products from production to consumption. He stressed that halal logistics is essential to maintain the integrity of the entire halal ecosystem.

Datuk Dr. Muhamad Farid further stated, "Malaysia has the potential to become a global leader in halal logistics, much like JAKIM's established authority in halal certification. By strategically positioning ourselves and collaborating with JAKIM, The Chartered Institute of Logistics & Transport in Malaysia (CILTM) can play a pivotal role in promoting and enhancing the understanding and value of halal logistics." The Makkah Halal Forum 2025 itself stands as a testament to the importance of such initiatives, underlining the vital role of halal logistics in the broader halal industry.

CILT MALAYSIA AND UTAR HOST INSIGHTFUL TALK ON THE SHIPBUILDING AND SHIP REPAIR INDUSTRY

The event also included an engaging Q&A session, where attendees had the chance to interact directly with Mr. Nazery. This collaboration between CILT Malaysia and UTAR marks another step toward building skilled human capital for Malaysia's growing logistics sector.


HARI RAYA ROAD SAFETY: TIPS FOR A SAFE JOURNEY HOME

ABSTRACT

The purpose of this paper is to investigate the research area of supply chain resilience. While a specific state-level 4IR policy for Sabah has not been announced, the state's active participation in national frameworks and councils indicates its dedication to embracing 4IR technologies to drive sustainable economic growth and improve the well-being of its residents.

Addressing Shortfalls in Malaysia's 2030 Road Safety Targets – A Call for Action

Global Decade of Action 2020 - 2030

1. Malaysia is now at the midway point of the Global Decade of Action 2030 which targets the reduction of the absolute figure of road deaths by 50% by the year 2030. Based on current performance Malaysia's 2030 targets are not achievable.

2. A reduction of 50% of the absolute figure of road deaths means Malaysia needs to reduce our road deaths from 6167 in 2019 (base year) to 3083 or below in 2030. Based on Malaysia's current road safety performance the target set under Malaysia Road Safety Plan 2022 – 2030 will not be met as the annual figure of road deaths has been increasing and the deflection point seems beyond reach unless drastic intervention measures are implemented during the remaining five (5) years from 2025 - 2030

1. Reversing our current high road deaths will require a holistic and coordinated effort of all agencies in Government, the private sector and road safety NGOs working together to change driver behavior, upgrade the safety of road infrastructure and improve the efficiency of law enforcement and revamp our Driver Merit Demerit Points System (KEJARA)

2. Intervention measures which are recommended for Malaysia to reduce the current heavy death toll on our roads are as follows: -

For Motorcyclists (70% of road deaths)

- upgrade the safety of road infrastructure for motorcyclists as 70% of deaths involve motorcyclists (JKR Guidelines for Motorcycle Facilities NTJ 33/2015 recommended construction of motorcycle lanes to improve rider safety)
- Introduce speed Control Devices and a vehicle speed limit of 70kmph for all motorcycles below 250cc to reduce speed as a major contributory factor to road crashes.
- increase the perception of being caught (P.O.B.C) for traffic offenses from the current 30% to 90% to put Malaysia on par with leading countries on road safety such as the USA, Sweden, Germany, UK, Japan and Australia.

Addressing Shortfalls in Malaysia's 2030 Road Safety Targets – A Call for Action

- revamp the driver merit and demerit system to ensure licenses of reckless and repeat traffic offenders are suspended without fear or favor and
- announce the number of CDL licenses suspended or revoked on a monthly basis to act as a deterrent to other drivers and riders.
- increase riders' visibility for night journeys by making safety vests compulsory from 7 pm onwards. Enhancing visibility can reduce the risk of rider crashes by as much as 30%.
- replicate the success of the MySafe Roads program implemented by MKJR Penang reducing road deaths by 10% in its first year of implementation to all states in Malaysia.

For cars and Passenger Vans (20% of road deaths)

effectively enforce rear seatbelt and child restraint systems (CRS) regulations to reduce the severity of occupant injuries in road crashes by 50%.

For Commercial Vehicles (50% of road deaths)

- step up implementation of the Industrial Code of Safety Practise (ICOP) as operator license condition for all commercial vehicles.
- reduce rampant corrupt practices in vehicle inspection and enforcement programs.
- step up the frequency and capacity of scheduled and road crash audits of commercial operators based on the ICOP audit framework implemented in 2013 by SPAD and now under the jurisdiction of JPJ

For Pedestrians (5% of deaths)

- introduce traffic calming in all pedestrian zones with a speed limit of 30kmph e.g. Schools, Hospitals.
- expand the pedestrian walkways network to promote safe walkability throughout Malaysia.
- introduce traffic free zones for shoppers and tourists in all our cities e.g. Petaling Street, Pasar Ramadhan.


Other General Safety Issues

Implement JKR Recommendations as Per Guidelines for Motorcycle Facilities (NTJ 33/2015)

1. JKR research findings published in 2015 (NTJ 33/2015) have recommended the construction of exclusive and nonexclusive motorcycle lanes to reduce rider deaths. These recommendations were made 10 years ago! How long do we have to wait before action is taken on these recommendations?

Antilock Braking Systems for all Motorcyclists

2. Recently the Ministry of Transport implemented a policy requesting all new motorcycles above 150cc to be installed with Anti-lock Braking Systems (ABS)


3. The proposed ABS policy is not comprehensive enough to have the desired impact of reducing road crashes. This policy should be expanded to all motorcycles below 150cc which form a significant segment of the motorcycle population. If we are serious about upgrading rider safety MOT should require all new motorcycles sold in Malaysia to be equipped with ABS. Is my recommendation drastic? Certainly not. To avoid serious rider injury in a road crash the impact speed during a crash should be 30kmph or below. This means even a rider traveling at a low speed of 70 kmph will need to reduce his speed rapidly in an emergency to achieve the desired minimum impact speed of 20-30kmph to avoid serious injury in a road crash. Hence the relevance of ABS for all riders is to reduce road deaths and severity of injuries.

Structural Issues on Road Safety

- Bahagian Keselamatan Jalan Raya (BKJR) under JPJ should be upgraded to an independent Road Safety Department under the Ministry of Transport to improve operational efficiency and road safety outcomes in a “hands on” manner compared to the present long process and hierarchy in decision making policy proposals and Malaysia Road Safety Plans monitoring and implementation.
- MIROS should focus on its core function of road safety research as spelled out under Akta MIROS 2012 and not overlap and duplicate with functions of other organizations to avoid the risk of irrelevance and redundancy. MIROS can only shine when its research findings and recommendations contribute to closing gaps in road safety outcomes by triggering new research-based policies road safety regulations and implementation plans.
- **Majlis Keselamatan Jalan Raya**
- (MKJR) needs to re-energize itself and reactivate some state branches lulled in complacency. MKJR needs to conduct frequent stakeholder workshops on road safety involving state branches, the private sector, and road safety NGOs.
- **Conclusion**
- 1. Malaysia's road safety efforts need a major shake-up and upscaling if Malaysia is to achieve her road safety targets of reducing the absolute figure of road deaths by 50% from 6167 in 2019 (base year) Business as usual is not an acceptable approach in the face of our ever-increasing death rate of epidemic proportions.



WiLAT Malaysia: WITI 2025/2026 Committee Meeting






