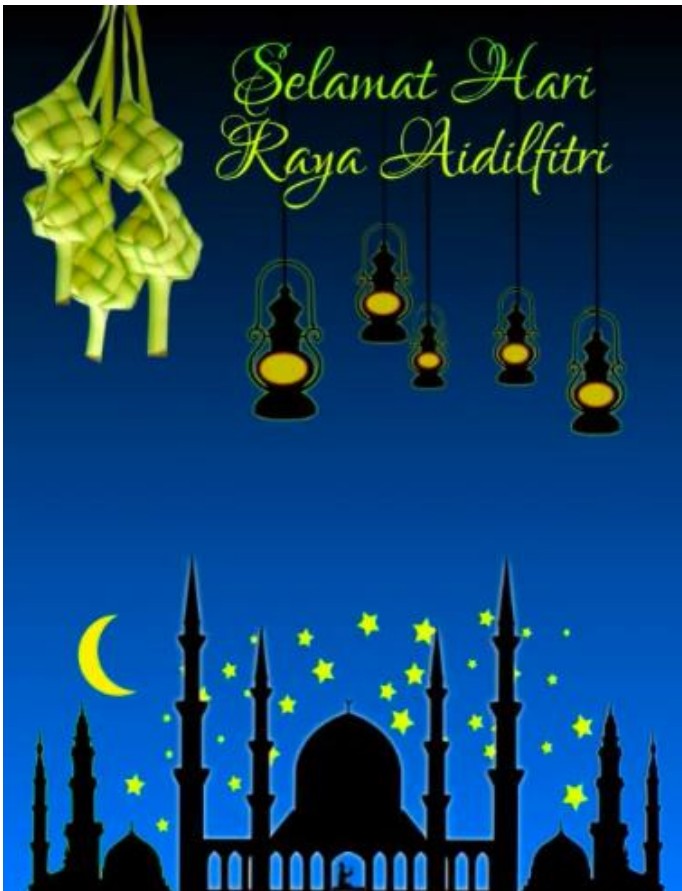

CILT Malaysia's Official Visit to Port Klang Authority

On March 21, 2023, The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport, Malaysia (CILTM) paid a courtesy visit to Capt. K. Subramaniam, General Manager, Port Kelang Authority (PKA). The visit was led by Dato' Ts Muhiyuddin Abdullah, President of CILT Malaysia, with its members, and were welcomed by the senior management from Port Klang Authority.

The main objective of the visit was to handover the prestigious Chartered Fellow (FCILT) membership to Captain K. Subramaniam who was unable to attend the Convocation ceremony in December 2022 due to his duty overseas. FCILT is the highest and most prestigious membership grade available within the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport, as a recognition being out a highly experienced professional who has reached the highest levels of achievement within logistics and transport. In addition the visit was also to introduce CILT to the PKA team and to discuss the possible collaboration between PKA and CILTM.

In his opening message, Capt K Subramaniam provided an overview of PKA's development and expressed their priority in professional development of their manpower, including their allied members and stakeholders. He emphasized the importance of continuous learning and development in the logistics and transport industry, as well as PKA's commitment to providing training and development opportunities to their employees and communities serving the ports and logistics sector.



He then introduced the members of his team, Azura binti Muhammad, *Assistant General Manager (Admin & Finance)*, Vijayaindaran R Viswalingam, *Assistant General Manager (Corporate & Development)*, Fazilah Surkisah Mohammad, *Legal Advisor*, Sri Muhunan Raja Retnam, *Senior Manager (Property Management)*, Adnan Abidin, *Senior Manager (Finance)*, Mohd Dzulcarnaen Musa, *Senior Manager (Human Resource)*, Shanti Gunaratnam, *Senior Manager (Planning & Development)*, Ahmad Rizal Mohd Yusop, *Manager Free Zone*, Nubhan Basaruddin, *Manager Dangerous Goods*, and Koh Chian Cheat, *Manager Corporate Communication*.



After the introduction Dato Mohammad Muhiyuddin began by thanking PKA for the warm welcome and congratulating Capt K Subramaniam on his achievements and his contribution towards the betterment of the port logistics and shipping sector. He commended Captain Subramaniam's visionary approach which has helped transform the port industry in Port Klang and Malaysia. His contributions have been recognized by many national and international organizations. He mentioned that Captain is an inspiration to many in the industry, and that he makes CILT Malaysia proud to have him as a member hence bestowing the Chartered Fellow grade to Captain Subramaniam.



Dato Mohammad Muhiyuddin then gave brief introduction of the delegates from CILT Malaysia. He shared CILTM's mission and vision of promoting excellence in logistics and transport, as well as the various initiatives and programs offered by CILTM to support the professional development requirements of the Malaysian logistics and transport sector.



Dato Dr Amin, as the CILTM Selangor State Section Chairperson, shared some insights on the role of Selangor Section as part of CILTM as a whole and acknowledged PKA and all the surrounding port terminals as CILTM partners in ensuring professional development of the people. He emphasized the importance of collaboration and partnerships in advancing the logistics and transport industry, and expressed his optimism for future opportunities for joint initiatives between CILTM and PKA.



Both parties explored potential collaboration opportunities. In the discussion CILTM spoke about providing Professional development training and certification courses for the drivers in the Trucking sector. The programme will begin with Haulage truck Drivers, where CILTM will propose to collaborate with the Association of Malaysian Hauliers (AMH). CILTM intends to initiate the 'Pilot Programme' towards the second half of 2023 with a few corporate members of CILTM in Port Klang and seeks the support of PKA. Captain Subramaniam indicated that PKA will support the initiative and he also shared an interest to provide industrial training for port terminals truck drivers, which was proposed by CILTM to work together with PKA in that project.



CILTM can also make arrangements for dedicated postgraduate degrees for senior officers of PKA and its terminals in the area of Ports and Maritime or MBA/DBA (Ports and Maritime Operations) on a part-time basis, which will have a significant impact on employee qualifications and professionalism. This proposal was also well-received by the PKA representatives, who expressed their enthusiasm for exploring this opportunity further.



The meeting concluded with the handing over of the FCILT Certificate to the General Manager of PKA and a group photo. Members of the meeting then adjourned to the Royal Selangor Yacht Club (RSYC) of Port Klang for a sumptuous lunch hosted by PKA.



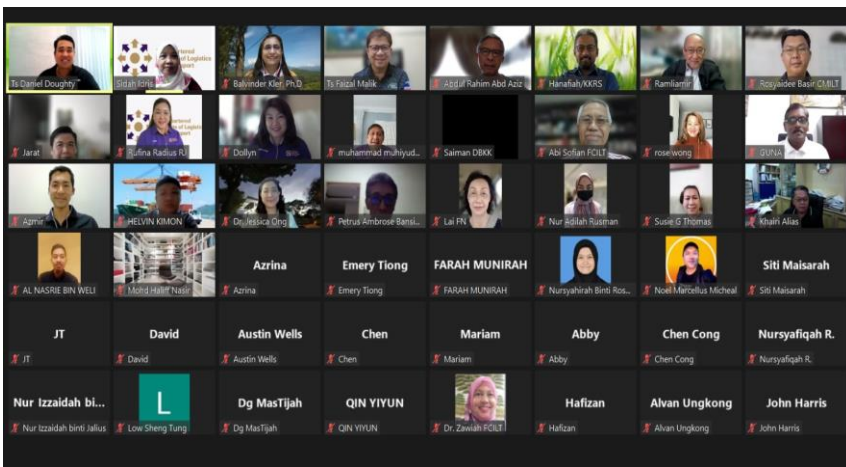

CILT Malaysia Sabah Section Invited to form Sabah Logistics Council Panel 25th March, Sabah

On the 25th of March, CILTM Sabah Section organized virtual forum from 9.30am to 11.30am covering the topic 'Civil Society: The Core of Urban Transport'. This forum was opened by Dato Mohammad Muhiyuddin Bin Abdullah FCILT, the president of CILT Malaysia and short speech by Dr. Oh Ei Sun FCILT, the chairman of CILTM Sabah Section. The forum was moderated by Ts Daniel Doughty, the director of Northgate Consultancy and chairman of Labuan Chamber of Commerce. The panelist in the forum were Datuk Mohd Hanafiah Mohd Kassim, the permanent secretary of the Ministry of Works, Sabah; Mr Saiman Angak, the director of traffic and transportation department of the Kota Kinabalu City Hall and Dr. Balwinder Kaur Kler, the director of Borneo Tourism Research Centre (BTRC), University Malaysia, Sabah.

The forum looked at the current Urban Transport Planning Masterplan 2014-2020 for Sabah, which was due for a review.



During the forum, Mr. Saiman indicated that the review in the masterplan has to take into account factors such as the technological development and sustainable practices. Dr. Balwinder, stressed on the importance of mobility and access for tourists in Sabah. She mentioned that tourism is one of the main economic contributors to Sabah and the urban transport masterplan must factor in facilitating tourists

. She proposed drawing from the example of Melbourne's transport system which is considered a traveller-friendly city. She also highlighted the importance of considering aesthetics, cultural and historical aspects of Kota Kinabalu in the masterplan. Datuk Hanafiah Mohd Kassim, during his session extended an invitation to CILTM Sabah section to join the committee to set up the Sabah Logistics Forum.

CILTM Sabah invited to form Sabah Logistics Council panel

KOTA KINABALU: The Chartered Institute of Logistic and Transport (CILTM) Sabah Section has been invited to be on the committee for the establishment of a Sabah Logistics Council.

This significant development will enable the council to address various transport logistics planning issues in the state more effectively, said CILTM Sabah Section Chairman Dr Oh Ei Sun in a statement Tuesday.

Hanafiah was one of the panellists in the session moderated by Ts Daniel Doughty. The other panellists were the Kota Kinabalu City Hall (DBKK) Traffic and Transportation Department Director Saiman Angak and Dr Balvinder Kaur Kler, Director of Tourism Research Centre, Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS).

During the forum, Saiman emphasised that it is of critical importance to review the Urban Transport Planning Masterplan 2014-2020, to ensure it remains current and relevant to the changing times and

technology.

Dr Balvinder, in her address, underscored the need to factor in tourism requirements in any future planning and drew on Melbourne's transport system as an excellent example of a traveller-friendly city. She further highlighted the importance of the aesthetic, cultural, and historical aspects of Kota Kinabalu city in planning.

Meanwhile, the CILT Malaysia President Dato Muhammad Muhiyuddin Abdullah praised CILTM Sabah Section for successfully holding the forum

He said CILTM will support whatever initiatives carried out by the Sabah State Government and CILT Sabah to improve the transport system in the State and he hopes more stakeholders will participate in the next discussion.

Dr Oh said the CILTM Sabah's forum marked a significant milestone, as it was the first of its kind for the year 2023.

The success of the event is a testament to the CILTM Sabah's unwavering commitment to promoting effective transport logistics planning in the region, he said, adding all stakeholders interested in future events are welcome to participate and contribute their ideas to this vital initiative.

UniKL organizes 'Coffee Talk' with CILTM

Ts Dr. Zawiah Abdul Majid FCILT, the immediate past WiLAT Global Vice Chair for South East Asia, together with University Kuala Lumpur, UniKL organized a 'coffee talk' on the 21st of March at the University's Aviation faculty known as UniKL MIAT. The program centered on CILTM's engagement and membership drive, focusing on the topic of collaboration between CILTM and universities for logistics and transport industry sustainability. The event was attended by more than 35 people, both physically and virtually. It was conducted in a hybrid format, with participants attending on Microsoft Teams and Facebook Live. Refreshments were served by the organizers, while CILTM sponsored 30 goodie bags for participants and three packs of mementos for panelists.

During the coffee talk, panelists discussed the global outlook on the logistics industry, highlighting that Asia is fast becoming the global hub of the industry, contributing about half of the world's trade growth by 2030. The need to adopt and adapt to stay afloat was emphasized, and strategic partnerships between institutions were encouraged to boost educational and co-curricular programs. Collaboration was touted as the way forward in the new world of higher education.

Panelists also addressed the issue of competition among institutions, which has led to a dramatic drop in enrollment. They suggested that collaboration among universities could enhance the value of education and benefit students. The panelists were asked about the best ways to collaborate and when to collaborate, and how CILTM and universities could further improve and explore collaboration in specific areas.



The President of CILTM, Dato' Muhammad Muhiyuddin, highlighted the need to interact with senior members in the industry to transfer experience, expertise, and opinions on transportation to students. He also emphasized that collaboration with CILTM and industry should align with government regulations and focus on university and course segmentation.

Among the attendees and panel speakers were the immediate past president of CILT International, Ts Dato Abdul Radzak Malek FCILT, his advisor Professor Khaeruddin Sudarman FCILT, Dato Dr Mohd Amin Kassim FCILT, the chairperson of CILTM Selangor Section and his vice-chair En. Omar Suhaimi FCILT. Also joining in were Prof Dato Hj Ahmad Zahir. Dialing in through zoom Paul Sainthouse, the president of CILT International, who greeted and delivered a short message to the audience. The event was deemed a success, with participants excited about future collaborations to enhance knowledge and add value to society.

Workshop on Malaysian Logistics Performance Index MLPI 2023
1st March 2023

The Faculty of Business and Management Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) and the Malaysian Productivity Corporation (MPC) have successfully conducted a workshop on Malaysia's Logistics Performance Index, on the 21st of March 2023. The event was held at the Shah Alam Convention Centre (SACC) from 9.00am to 4.30pm and was organized in collaboration with the International Business Forum (IBF), CILTM Selangor Section, and the Federation of Freight Forwarders (FMFF).



The workshop received an overwhelming response from freight forwarders, with approximately 100 participants attending. The event began with a Step-up program conducted by Prof. Kamaruzaman Jahidin, Associate Fellow of MPC.

The opening speech was delivered by Dato Tony Chia, the President of Selangor Freight Forwarder Association (SFFLA), who highlighted the significant role of logistics in economic development and shared insights on Trade Logistics Excellence – Way Forward. After lunch, Associate Professor Dr Harlina Suzana Jaafar from UiTM presented the importance and needs of measuring the logistics performance in Malaysia, highlighting the strategic improvement of the industry to achieve competitive advantage, followed by the MLPI survey session.



The workshop also invited Dr. Siva Sangar Krishnan, the Deputy Under Secretary III of the Strategic Planning and International Division, Logistics Section, Ministry of Transport (MoT), to introduce the newly developed project, Malaysia Maritime Single Window. This project was developed jointly by the MoT and MPC.

The event was concluded by En. Muhammad Firdaus Baharudin, the Assistant Director of Customs for the Customs Division in RMCD, Putrajaya, representing Puan Zuraini bt Othman, The Operation Director of Customs and Technical Services, Royal Malaysia Customs Department (RMCD) Central Zone, Uni II (Selangor). He presented on the Role of Customs in Trade Facilitation.

This event has created a platform for industry stakeholders to collaborate and contribute to the development of the logistics industry in Malaysia. We look forward to more opportunities for collaboration in the future.



2023 Outlook For Ports And Logistics, Bumpy And Smooth

The WTO in Oct 2022 cut its 2023 global trade growth projection to a meagre 1% (vs. 3.4% projected six months ago). This is against a backdrop of a recession in Europe that is almost a foregone conclusion given the protracted Russia-Ukraine war, leading to an energy crisis.

Meanwhile, China's reopening is likely to be gradual which means there will not be an immediate end to global supply chain disruptions. Globally, consumer confidence and spending are likely to take a beating on sustained elevated inflation, rising interest rates, and a slowing global economy. Kenanga believes this will not augur well for seaport operators like Westport however Bintulu Port could be able to weather these macro challenges better thanks to its stable operation in the handling of LNG cargoes, a potential tariff hike at Bintulu Port as well as the long-term growth potential of Samalaju Industrial Port's hinterland in Samalaju, Sarawak is driven by the growing investment in heavy industries.

11 Malaysians rescued off Tawi-Tawi

ZAMBOANGA CITY: A Marshall Islands-flagged bulk carrier bound for China rescued 11 Malaysians off the southern Philippine province of Tawi-Tawi after their speedboat's engine malfunctioned, a Filipino Navy commander Brig. Gen. Romeo Racadio said on Tuesday.

Racadio, quoting a report, said the private speedboat departed Tawau City for Semporna City in Sabah on March 28, but the engine's injection pump malfunctioned and the boat, battered by huge waves and strong current due to bad weather, drifted toward Sibutu Strait.

"The crew tried to fix it to no avail, causing them to drift to Sibutu Strait, after being hit by big waves and strong currents due to bad weather conditions," Racadio said.

The bulk carrier MV Tomini Dynasty spotted the speedboat and rescued the passengers after informing the Philippine Navy.
