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Education & Career Fair 2022 2nd December, 2022 World Trade Centre, Kuala Lumpur



Malaysian Experience in the Logistics Support and Supply Delivery for Peace Keeping Operations in Lebanon

This article is a memoir of a former Chief Logistics Officer - MALCON East 4 on his experience in the logistics support and supply delivery to Malaysian Contingent (MALCON East 4 and MALCON West 2) during his tour of duty to Lebanon under the United Nations Peace Keeping Operations (UNPKO) in Lebanon from April 2009 to April 2010. This article covers the overview of peace keeping operations, concept of logistics support and operations, mission support plan, challenges and the lessons learnt.

With the end of Cold War, the international community has placed the United Nations (UN) at the centre stage in its effort to resolve the outstanding tensions and to calm newly emerging dispute. The Peace Keeping Operations under the UN flag has been seen as the most effective technique and method, by which the troops have been developed mainly by the United Nations to control and resolve armed conflicts.

Malaysian diplomacy has always vigorously advocated cooperation among nations to achieve and sustain peace and stability at the regional and global levels, and that is why there has been a long succession of Malaysian Battalion (MALBATT) and observers in the peace keeping operations of the United Nations.

Honestly, at that point I just thought it was one those SARS things that had occurred way back in 2003 and that this too would be contained within 6 months. I was sure this wouldn't even reach our shores and continued with my life in the fast lane.

Miti: Malaysia's trade expanded 15.6pc to RM238b last month

Malaysia's trade continued its stellar performance and maintained an upward trade trajectory in November 2022 with expanded by 15.6 per cent to RM238.17 billion compared to November 2021 — the 22nd consecutive month of year-on-year (y-o-y) double-digit expansion.

The Ministry of International Trade and Industry (Miti) said in a statement today that exports rose by 15.6 per cent to RM130.24 billion, while imports and trade surplus increased by 15.6 per cent each to RM107.93 billion and RM22.3 billion respectively.

Malaysian shipping struggling to catch up, while ports 'anchor aweigh' from troubled waters

Malaysia's Maritime industry had a mixed development in 2022, with the shipping business slowly steaming in rough waters, attempting to recover from the hard knocks of the Covid-19 pandemic, and rebuilding it amid a lack of directional stability. However, the ports have started gaining momentum.

The Malaysian ports, especially those with greater exposure to the global supply chain, are seen to be consistently improving their efficiency and capacity to compete with regional players, while simultaneously embedding digitalisation.

In the latter half of the year, shipping rates for both dry bulk carriers and container ships have come off the highest levels triggered when the Covid-19 pandemic disrupted the supply chain, causing port congestion, shortage of shipping containers and increased blank sailings by carriers.

Heading into 2023, shipping players and analysts are expecting global freight rates to fall further due to the greater availability of freight capacity globally and weaker freight volumes as the global economy deteriorates.




